

Phelisanong Orphans, Disabled, and HIV/AIDS Project

a community project in Lesotho, southern Africa

Phelisanong operates a health clinic out of a tiny 10x10 rondavel style hut in the village of Ha Makhata. In addition to providing basic medications, birth control, condoms and nutritional supplements, the clinic dispenses TB medications for local tuberculosis patients and anti-retroviral therapy for HIV positive orphans.

The clinic's two nurses see up to 500 patients a month. Additionally, the clinic is used by the HIV/AIDS Outreach Workers (known as Warriors) as an office, meeting room, and centre for holding HIV support group meetings and patient counselling. There is an urgent need to expand the clinic to provide indoor plumbing for sanitation, as well as add another consultancy room for nurses and Warriors to practice alongside one another.

Currently, patients who have come to see the nurses at the clinic must wait outside in the open air, rain or shine. A sheltered area where patients can meet, and wait in comfort, is also required.
